Ruth has conducted numerous trainings on civil litigation in human trafficking cases, assisted forced labor human trafficking clients seeking civil remedies, trained transit operators to identify human trafficking, partnered with minority bar associations and community organizations to hold clinics that screen for human trafficking, and worked collaboratively with victim service providers and immigration attorneys in human trafficking cases.

She has received both the California State Bar and Santa Clara County's Pro Bono Award and the Overall Wonder Woman Award from the Santa Clara County Office of the Status of Women and the Office of Women's Policy. In 2020, she received the Freedom Fighter Award from the Silicon Valley/San Jose NAACP, and, together with Lynette Parker, she was awarded the Paul and Sheila Wellstone Award from Freedom Network, USA.
